NOT COMPLYING

- The state governments are **not publishing the information** they are obligated to under RTI Act 2005
- They are **failing us** and failing the law
- **29% is the average rate of compliance** amongst state public authorities studied



WHAT IS THE LAW?

- Section 4 of the RTI Act, requires all public authorities to publish detailed information without being requested
- This is the governments **DUTY TO PUBLISH** (DTP) information.
- It is mandatory for all authorities under the Indian government



MEASURING WHAT MATTERS

- **DTP is the cornerstone of the RTI Act 2005**, and holds out the hope of inculcating functional transparency in government.
- Measuring the progress of government departments in complying with this law will help **push them to be more transparent**

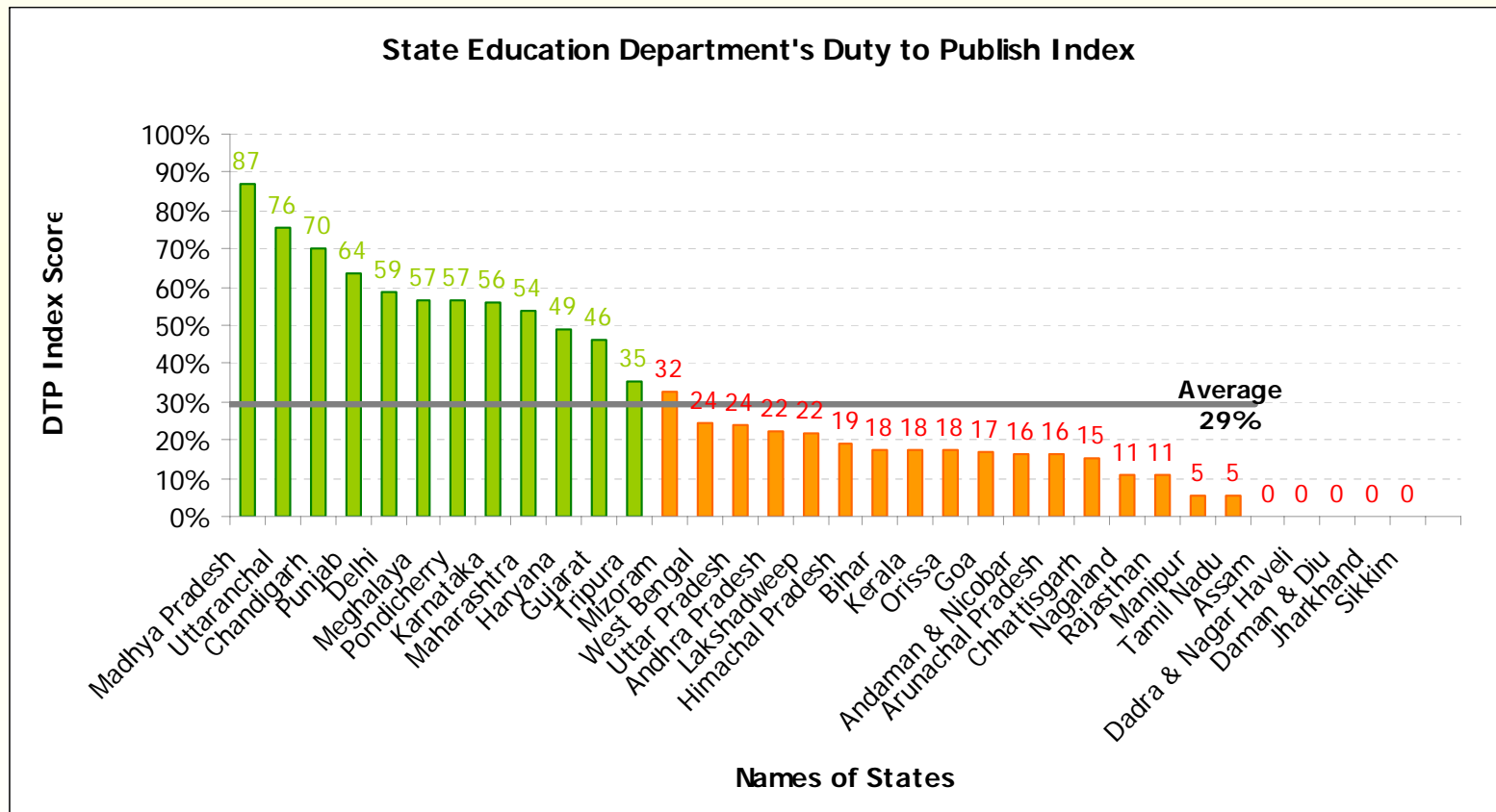


DTP INDEX

- We divided section 4 into 37 points of compliance
- We assessed the education departments of state governments
- We converted their score into a percentage of 37
- The results constitute the DTP Index
